Over the past year the Obici Healthcare Foundation has awarded Community Engagement grants in the amount of \$146,464.00.

Community Engagement Grants are awarded to improve the health status of the community. They are awarded at \$5,000 or less and generally granted once in a 12-month period.

In March 2020, local nonprofits began facing complex challenges due to the global health crisis. The Obici Healthcare Foundation granted over \$45,000 of Community Engagement Grants within one week to organizations providing critical services. The Foundation will continue to collaborate with nonprofits that elevate our community throughout this dynamic time.
